- Retains a lobbyist to work exclusively on Massachusetts state-level and provisional Licensure for Clinical Fellows
- Attends hearings at the Massachusetts State House to testify on behalf of the membership
- Protects our practice from infringement by other professions
- Ensures access to treatment for individuals with dyslexia, traumatic brain injuries, and cochlear implants
- Sends periodic advocacy updates to keep members knowledgeable about relevant state and federal issues
